

## **Opportunity**

Despite being the largest economy in southeast Asia, Indonesia still faces challenges when it comes to nutrition and child development outcomes. Thirty-one per cent of children under five are stunted, with wide variations across provinces.

The Government of Indonesia has demonstrated a commitment to reducing malnutrition and has been working to decrease undernutrition rates. Despite the progress that has been made there are still large gaps in the provision of basic nutrition services. In 2018 the government launched the National Strategy to Accelerate Stunting Prevention (2018 - 2024) to strengthen the execution of existing multisectoral policy frameworks and drive consolidation and convergence of national and sub-national programs.

## Investment

The Better Investment for Stunting Alleviation (BISA) program supports the government's national strategy to accelerate stunting prevention. Recognizing that stunting in Indonesia has significant gender dimensions, BISA has been designed to assist the Government of Indonesia in improving nutrition before pregnancy and the critical first 1,000 days of a child's life – from conception to age two. Nutrition International and Save the Children are uniquely positioned to deliver this program, building on existing networks and relationships in Indonesia, and leveraging global experience and expertise to deliver evidence-based, high-quality health and nutrition programs.

## Innovation

From caregivers to health workers and decision-makers at the village level and above, BISA will provide the training and support required to improve nutrition knowledge and practices as well as influence nutrition policies. This ensures that these changes will be sustainable and continue to contribute to the national government's goal of eliminating stunting in the country.

- At the household and community level, BISA will build targeted information and behaviour change campaigns to shift attitudes and norms around breastfeeding, water, sanitation and hygiene, and complementary feeding. BISA will also target school-going adolescent girls with nutrition education.
- At the system level, the priority will be to develop capacity to deliver quality nutrition services at the community level by increasing the knowledge and skills health workers. Support will be given through targeted trainings for health workers, supervisory staff and relevant stakeholders, as well as assistance to District and Provincial authorities to improve supply chain management so local facilities have the necessary supplies.
